How much does a solar module cost in Europe?

Producing a solar module in Europe with EU-made solar cells costs around EUR0.103 (\$0.12)/W more than producing the same module in China, according to a new report.

How many solar panels does the EU need a year?

From 2024, the EU needs to install at least 70 GW of solar per year to reach its climate targets. The European Commission calls solar the 'kingpin' of REPowerEU - the continent's effort to get off Russian gas. Solar panels are even featured prominently on a REPowerEU banner at the European Commission headquarters.

Why are European solar module manufacturers struggling in 2023 & 2024?

In 2023 and 2024, European solar module manufacturers have faced a particular challenge due to a sharp drop in the prices of imported panels.

Will EU-made solar modules be more expensive than Chinese imports?
